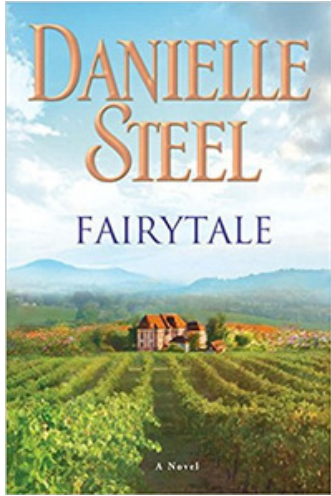


NEW AND UPCOMING ITEMS!

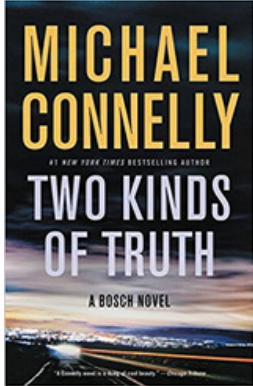
